Accountable


Called to take responsibility for one's actions.

Lacking intelligence and vitality; dull.


Sarah refused to be **gormless** like some people that she heard of, so she studied everything that she could her hands on.

A hidden fund or supply stored for future use; a cache.


Malcolm had to restrain himself from disclosing his **hoard** to his sister.

To demonstrate or prove to be just, right, or valid.


Paul began to **justify** how he was right in adding more responsibility to his brothers list of chores.

Having or exercising the ability to reason.


Nathan believed that it would be **rational** to get advice on how to do his science project.

Conformity to fact or actuality.


Jamir knew that he was always to tell the **truth**.

Being the winner in a contest or struggle.


John learned from experience that a person would not always be **victorious**.
